The Meeting of our Lord Jesus Christ in the Temple

THE ORDER OF THE BAPTISMAL LITURGY

At the threshold of the nave, prayers of exorcism are read over the initiate, and the sponsor makes the profession of faith on his behalf. Then we process to the baptismal font and begin the Liturgy. Special petitions are added to the **Great Litany**. The **baptismal waters** are consecrated, and the initiate is anointed with the **Oil of Gladness**. He is then **baptized**. **Psalm 31** is read as he comes up from the water. The baptismal garment is placed upon him as we sing: **Tone 8 – Troparion of Vesting** Grant unto <u>me</u> the <u>robe of</u> light, O Most <u>Mer</u>ciful <u>Christ our</u> God, who clothe Your<u>self</u> with <u>light</u> as with a <u>gar</u>ment!

Then the Beatitudes with the Little Entrance. We sing the Hymns of the Day while the initiate finishes dressing.

HYMNS OF THE DAY

Tone 7 – Resurrectional Troparion

By Your <u>Cross</u> You destroyed <u>death</u>. To the thief You opened <u>Par</u>adise. For the <u>Myrrh</u>bearers You changed weeping into joy. And You commanded Your disciples, O <u>Christ</u> God, to pro<u>claim</u> that You are <u>ris</u>en,// granting the <u>world</u> great <u>mercy</u>.

Tone 1 – Troparion of the Feast

Rejoice, O Virgin Theotokos, <u>Full</u> of Grace! From you shone the Sun of Righteousness, <u>Christ</u> our God, enlightening those who sat in <u>dark</u>ness. Rejoice and be glad, O righteous <u>Eld</u>er, you accepted in your arms the <u>Redeem</u>er of our souls,// Who grants us the Resur<u>rec</u>tion!

Tone 7 – Resurrectional Kontakion

The do<u>min</u>ion of <u>death</u> can no longer hold men <u>cap</u>tive, for Christ de<u>scen</u>ded, shattering and destroying its <u>pow</u>ers. Hell is bound, while the Prophets rejoice and cry: "The Savior has <u>come</u> to those in <u>faith</u>;// enter, you faithful, in<u>to</u> the Resur<u>rec</u>tion!"

Tone 1 – Kontakion of the Feast

By Your Na<u>tiv</u>ity You sanctified the <u>Virg</u>in's womb and blessed Simeon's hands, ^O <u>Christ</u> God. Now You have come and saved <u>us</u> through love. Grant <u>peace</u> to all Orthodox <u>Chris</u>tians,// O only <u>Lov</u>er of Man!

The newly-illumined is annointed with the Holy Chrism. Then the priest leads a procession around the baptismal font as we sing:

Instead of the Trisagion:

As many as have been baptized into Christ have put on Christ: Alleluia! (*3x*)

Glory... now and ever... Have put on Christ: Alleluia!

SCRIPTURE READINGS

Tone 7 – Resurrectional Prokeimenon (Psalm 28)

The Lord shall give strength to His people. The Lord shall bless His people with peace!

Tone 3 – Song of the Theotokos (Luke 1)

My soul magnifies the Lord, / and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior!

Epistle: 1 Timothy 4.9-15 (Sunday)

Brethren: This is a faithful saying and worthy of all acceptance. For to this end we both labor and suffer reproach, because we trust in the living God, who is the Savior of all men, especially of those who believe. These things command and teach. Let no one despise your youth, but be an example to the believers in word, in conduct, in love, in spirit, in faith, in purity. Till I come, give attention to reading, to exhortation, to doctrine. Do not neglect the gift that is in you, which was given to you by prophecy with the laying on of the hands of the eldership. Meditate on these things; give yourself entirely to them, that your progress may be evident to all.

Hebrews 7.7-17 (Feast)

Brethren: Beyond all contradiction the lesser is blessed by the better. Here mortal men receive tithes, but there He receives them, of whom it is witnessed that He lives. Even Levi, who receives tithes, paid tithes through Abraham, so to speak, for he was still in the loins of his father when Melchizedek met him. Therefore, if perfection were through the Levitical priesthood (for under it the people received the law), what further need was there that another priest should rise according to the order of Melchizedek, and not be called according to the order of Aaron?

For, the priesthood being changed, there is also necessarily a change of the law. For He of whom these things are spoken belongs to another tribe, from which no man has officiated at the altar. For it is evident that our Lord arose from Judah, of which tribe Moses spoke nothing concerning priesthood.

And it is yet far more evident if, in the likeness of Melchizedek, there arises another priest who has come, not according to the law of a fleshly commandment, but according to the power of an endless life. For He testifies: "You are a priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek."

Romans 6.3-11 (Baptism)

Brethren: Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? We were buried, therefore, with Him by baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

For if we have been united with Him in a death like His, we shall certainly be united with Him in a resurrection like His. We know that our old self was crucified with Him, so that the sinful body might be destroyed, and we might no longer be enslaved to sin. For He who has died is freed from sin. But if we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with Him. For we know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over Him. The death He died, He died to sin once for all, but the life He lives, He lives to God. So, you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Gospel: Luke 19.1-10 (Sunday)

At that time, Jesus entered and passed through Jericho. Now behold, there was a man named Zacchaeus who was a chief tax collector, and he was rich. And he sought to see who Jesus was, but could not because of the crowd, for he was of short stature. So he ran ahead and climbed up into a sycamore tree to see Him, for He was going to pass that way.

And when Jesus came to the place, He looked up and saw him, and said to him, "Zacchaeus, make haste and come down, for today I must stay at your house." So he made haste and came down, and received Him joyfully.

But when they saw it, they all complained, saying, "He has gone to be a guest with a man who is a sinner."

Then Zacchaeus stood and said to the Lord, "Look, Lord, I give half of my goods to the poor; and if I have taken anything from anyone by false accusation, I restore fourfold." And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, because he also is a son of Abraham; for the Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost."

Luke 2.22-40 (Feast)

Now when the days of Mary's purification according to the law of Moses were completed, they brought Jesus to Jerusalem to present Him to the Lord as it is written in the law of the Lord: "Every male who opens the womb shall be called holy to the Lord," and to offer a sacrifice according to what is said in the law of the Lord: "A pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons."

And behold, there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon, and this man was just and devout, waiting for the Consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. And it had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ.

So, he came by the Spirit into the temple. And when the parents brought in the Child Jesus, to do for Him according to the custom of the law, he took Him up in his arms and blessed God and said: "Lord, now You are letting Your servant depart in peace, according to Your word; for my eyes have seen Your salvation, which You have prepared before the face of all peoples: a light to bring revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory of Your people Israel." And Joseph and His mother marveled at those things which were spoken of Him.

Then Simeon blessed them, and said to Mary His mother, "Behold, this Child is destined for the fall and rising of many in Israel, and for a sign which will be spoken against (yes, a sword will pierce through your own soul also), that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed."

Now there was one, Anna, a prophetess, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age, and had lived with a husband seven years from her virginity; and this woman was a widow of about eighty-four years, who did not depart from the temple, but served God with fastings and prayers night and day. And, coming in that instant, she gave thanks to the Lord and spoke of Him to all those who looked for redemption in Jerusalem.

So, when they had performed all things according to the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own city, Nazareth. And the Child grew and became strong in spirit, filled with wisdom; and the grace of God was upon Him.

Matthew 28.16-20 (Baptism)

At that time, the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. And when they saw Him, they worshiped Him; but some doubted. And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teach-ing them to observe all that I have commanded you; and behold, I am with you always, even to the end of the age."
